Friday saw us take part in our first Pause Day of the year. A pause day is when we take a pause from the curriculum for a short time to learn about something in more depth. 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Classroom Focus

RECEPTION

In Reception we have immersed ourselves in our new topic-Light and Dark.

The children have been particularly excited to explore some new roleplay areas- a vets for wild animals, a space shuttle (created by the children) and Bonfire Night as well as our 'dark tent'. These areas have sparked lots of discussion and collaboration between the children and it has been lovely to see how their ability to work within teams grow. The challenges of turn taking and sharing always come hand in hand with the introduction of exciting new things of course- we have been joining the children in their play helping them to negotiate and introducing tools such as the use of a sand-timer.

In phonics we have been focussing on recognising letter sounds at speed, hearing how sounds blend together to make words (e.g c-a-t....cat!) and blending known sounds together to read short words. We have also been learning how to write the sounds and how to use our 'Fred Fingers' to write words. Starting to write words has been so exciting and we are beginning to see the children apply their new learning in their independent play too. Do have a go at reading our 'password' on the small blackboard as you arrive in the mornings- we love to hear it!

In Maths we have revisited important counting skills- saying one number per object, saying numbers in order and knowing that the last number that you say is the total. We have also revisited the concepts of 'more' and 'fewer' as well as exploring 'equal' when setting a picnic up for our toy elephants.


