Jigsaw

Jigsaw is our new scheme for teaching PSHE. It is a mindful approach to PSHE, bringing together

Forest School

Mrs Archer is a qualified Forest School Leader and, along with Mrs Fosbery (qualified Forest School Assistant), run Forest School sessions for KS1. These take place on the school field and small wooded area within the school grounds.

Forest School is an approach to promoting the holistic development of children in the outdoor environment on a regular basis. It supports the relationship between the learner and the natural world and gives opportunities to take supported, appropriate risks. There will be a strong emphasis on raising all children's self-esteem and independence.


Phonics and RWI

We have enhanced our literacy, focussing on the Read Write Inc. phonics scheme

- This combines writing skills alongside reading
 - There is a focus on accuracy and fluency
 - Development of comprehension
 - Focus on segmenting words for spelling

- 1 RWI Book bag book to read independently
- 2 Sharing book with an adult
- 3 Online book to revisit for fluency

Phonics and RWI

Set 1, 2, 3

Red words - said Nonsense (alien) words - croab

Set 1 These are mainly consist of one letter sounds along with ch, sh, th, nk and ng Set 2 ay, ee, igh, ow, oo, oo, or, ar, air, ir, ou, oy


Set 3 teaches the more complicated sounds ea, oi, a-e, i-e, ai, oa, o-e, u-e, aw, are (as in care), ur, er, ow (as in cow), ew, ire, ear and ure.

Please ensure that only pure sounds are used (e.g. /r/ should not have an "uh" after it) Videos of teachers modelling this on website

Assessments

We assess the learning throughout the year, and SATS forms a part of this in the Summer term. It is often something that children enjoy and we encourage it to be a positive experience – some children won't be aware they are being assessed.

There will be a phonics screening in Summer term for those who didn't pass in Year 1.
