## **Personal, Social and Emotional Development:**

Listening to others in one-to-one or small groups.

Using language to recall past experiences and talk about things that are important to them.

Following directions.

Beginning to use talk to explain what is happening.

# **Physical Development:**

Washing and drying hands and understanding why this is important to us.

Naming and identifying some parts of the body.

Observing the effects of activity on their body.

Balance, stability and spatial awareness.

Creating lines and circles, pivoting from the shoulder and elbow

# Literacy:

To listen and join in with stories and poems.

Join in with repeated refrains.

Handles books and touch screens carefully.

Makes up stories and play scenarios.

Sometimes gives meaning to drawings and paintings that they produce independently.

Includes mark making in their play.
